Peter Sanders innovative approach to, and passionate involvement in architecture for 40 years developed from his post graduation experiences in offices ranging from Le Corbusier Chandigarh project, Richard Sheppard, Robson Partners, London and Lars Bryde Architect in Stockholm.

Throughout his practicing years he pioneered extensive use of off-form concrete along with advanced construction techniques. The knowledge and experience gained through his practicing years was generously shared with his employees and architectural colleagues.

Peter has served the Institute with distinction as a Chapter Councilor for a total of nine years, serving also as Chair of the Public Services Committee, his enthusiasm for quality education led to his membership of the National Education Committee and as Chair of the Committee for preparation of the Business and Practice of Architecture Continuing Education Program.

The design quality of his work has been recognized with RAI A Awards covering multiple housing projects and works to the National Gallery of Victoria.

Peter's widespread involvement in voluntary professional work has been extensive, beginning with his position as a founding member of the Carlton Association from 1968-1974 which strongly influenced Government attitudes to urban renewal and continuing as a member of the Aesthetics Advisory Committee to Melbourne City Council (9 years), Planning Advisor to the City of Collingwood, and involvement in the design and implementation of a Wildlife Corridor in central Victoria from 2002-2004.
